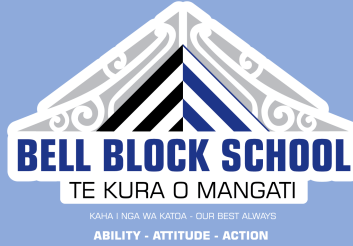

Senior Team Camp

In Term 4, our Senior Team students will be attending Vertical Horizon Camp from 31 October to 2 November. We are requesting voluntary donations towards the camp, we will need to raise \$18,000.00 to enable the camp to go ahead, this equates to \$180.00 per student. The donations are to help towards the cost of the food, activities and accommodation. Any donations made by parents are tax-deductible and parents can claim an income tax credit from Inland Revenue in relation to any donations made to the school. We will provide parents with a donation receipt.

The deadline for donations is **Wednesday 19 October**. The following week the decision will be made on whether we have received enough donations for the camp to go ahead. We appreciate your help with this, as without parental support we would be unable to offer these opportunities to the students.

New Enrolments 2023

The Board invites applications from parents who wish to enrol their sons and daughters at Bell Block School for next year. Parents of students who live within the home zone should apply to assist the school to plan appropriately for next year. *Please note that children with siblings currently enrolled who live outside of the school zone must apply as an out of zone student.*

Enrolment at the school is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available from the school office.

To apply for a place for your child please download an enrolment form from the Enrolments page of the school website and provide your child's birth certificate and immunisation record to the school office.

Applications for out of zone enrolments for 2023 must be received by **3:30pm on Monday 26 September 2022** (please see the timeline below for further information).

The exact number of out of zone places available will depend on the number of applications received from students who live within the school's home zone. If the number of out of zone applications exceeds the number of places available, students will be selected by ballot. If a ballot is required it will be held on 28 September 2022. Parents will be informed of the outcome of the ballot within three school days of the ballot being held.

Stay well, get vaccinated

- COVID-19 (first, second or boosters)
- Measles, mumps, rubella (MMR)
- Flu (eligibility criteria apply)

Come along to any of the clinics listed below to get your free vaccinations! They are the best way to help you and your whānau stay well.

COVID-19
If it's been three months since you've tested positive for COVID-19, you can now get your next vaccination. You can get COVID-19 again so it's important you're up to date with your vaccinations.

MMR
Are your tamariki under five vaccinated against measles? It's a serious disease that's highly contagious. Many children missed their FREE measles vaccinations due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Your tamariki needs two doses of the measles vaccine to be fully protected.

Flu vaccination
Flu vaccination is free for people aged 65 and over, Māori and Pacific people aged 55 and over, people who are pregnant, people under 65 with underlying health issues (like asthma, diabetes, and heart disease and some cancers), children aged 3-12 and people with serious mental health or addiction needs.

Call for Scholarship Applications for Year 8 students commencing secondary education in 2023

The Kiley Family Memorial Trust was established in 2000 by brothers John and the late Peter Kiley. Revenue from the Kiley Family Memorial Trust owned farm in Taranaki funds the Kiley Family Memorial Trust Scholarships to help young people who are facing financial challenges meeting their education costs.

Eligible to Year 8 students who plan to attend:

- Taranaki / Whanganui based Secondary Schools in 2023 or
 - Wellington based Catholic Secondary Schools in 2023
- Day School and Boarding Scholarships are available.

Preference is given to students from less well-off backgrounds who would otherwise have difficulty paying their school fees and meeting other school costs.

Applications for any field of study will be considered but further preference will be given to those students planning a career in agriculture related fields.
