#### **Road Closure: Mangati Road and Parklands Avenue Intersection**

The intersection of Mangati Road and Parklands Avenue will be fully closed 24/7 for approximately 9-10 weeks from *Monday 22 May to Saturday 22 July* for the installation of a permanent roundabout. The site and detour is shown in the map below. Road users are asked to plan ahead and take alternative routes where possible. Alternative routes will be clearly signposted for the duration of the closure.



#### **Attendance**

Regular and punctual attendance at school is very important. A student who is unnecessarily absent misses valuable and important learning opportunities. Poor attendance patterns can affect a student's life chances. Truancy has to be acted upon by the school (Education & Training Act 2020). Research shows that absences of more than 10 days per year has a direct negative effect on student achievement.


