Solar Power

During the holidays we have had some property upgrades completed including the drainage system and also the installation of two banks of solar panels. As a school, this is a way of becoming more environmentally sustainable and also creating some significant savings for the school moving forward. One bank of panels has been installed on the roof of the main Junior block and the second is on the Murray Street side of the Room 20 roof. This system will pay for itself in a matter of years and then create significant savings on power, allowing more of our government funding to go to resourcing, staffing and providing opportunities for students. It will also provide a great learning opportunity for our students in Science and links to our *Kaitiakitanga – Guardianship* unit.
