Class Placement 2025

After a busy term we now turn our attention to Term 4 and beyond to 2025. With that in mind, we are beginning the process of organising the class placements for next year. Each year half of our students move classes and join a new team. In preparation for this, your child will be asked for the names of some students who they would prefer to be placed with next year. It is a very good idea to have a talk with your child about who they work well with and who helps their learning so they can make a good choice. Just being placed with their best friends can be detrimental for their learning. In the past, some students have made very odd requests that have led to a great deal of anguish for themselves and their parents. Again, we cannot guarantee that the students will be placed with the first person on their list but we do our best to ensure the students are placed with someone they have requested.

As always, we invite parent input into the class placement process. We make no promises but do take parent shared information into account when placing students. This is not an opportunity to directly request a teacher as staff placements for 2025 have not yet been confirmed, or a particular student for your child to be placed with, but rather an opportunity to share the things that will help your child make the most of the learning opportunities, for example – strengths in maths, P.E. or writing. 2025 Out of Zone Enrolments

The Board invites applications from parents who wish to enrol their children at Bell Block School for next year. Enrolment at the school is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available from the school office.

To apply for a place for your child please download an enrolment form from the Enrolments page of our <u>website</u> and provide your child's birth certificate and immunisation record to the school office. Enrolment packs are also available from the school office.

The exact number of places available will depend on the number of applications received from students who live within the school's home zone.

If the number of out of zone applications exceeds the number of places available, students will be selected by ballot. If a ballot is required it will be held on Wednesday 16 October 2024. Parents will be informed of the outcome of the ballot within three school days of the ballot being held.

Please note that children with siblings currently enrolled who live outside of the school zone must apply as an out of zone student.

Waitara High School Proposed Enrolment Zone

We have been approached by the Ministry of Education to provide feedback about the proposed Waitara High School enrolment zone. As this may affect and limit the options of some of our families when choosing a high school, we are reaching out to the community for feedback. We will collate this information and send it to the Ministry on behalf of our community.

The section of the proposed zone that may affect some of our families is described below:

- 1. The zone starts at the intersection of Henwood Road and the main rail line.
- 2. The zone then follows Henwood Road north to the roundabout at the intersection of Henwood Road, Pohutukawa Place, Nugent Street and the Bell Block Shopping Centre.
 - Addresses off Pohutukawa Place are not in zone.
- 3. From the roundabout, the zone proceeds north on Nugent Street to the intersection of Nugent Street and Parklands Avenue.
 - Addresses off Warkworth Grove are in zone.
- 4. At the intersection of Nugent Street and Parklands Avenue the zone travels west to the intersection of Parklands Avenue and Waipu View Drive.
 - All addresses off Nadine Stanton Drive are in zone.
 - All addresses off Sunset Street are in zone.
 - All addresses off Impact Avenue are in zone.
- 5. From the intersection of Parklands Avenue and Waipu View Drive the zone follows Waipu View Drive and travels overland in a straight line to point on the Taranaki Coast/Tasman Sea.
 - All addresses off Waipu View Drive are in zone.
