Taranaki Milk Top Challenge

Our school is participating in the Taranaki Milk Top Challenge. During Term 2, please save all your milk bottle tops from 1, 2 or 3 litre dairy milk and cream bottles and bring them to school - washed and air dried. There will be a collection box in every classroom and in the office.

What's the problem?

Milk is in most of our homes. We know to put the bottle in the recycling bin but often get confused about the tops. Bottle tops and container lids are the most common contaminant found in our kerbside recycling.

Milk tops (and other small lids and caps) are too small to be collected through our kerbside recycling and often end up in landfills. In fact, removing lids from bottles and containers is now a requirement for all kerbside collections across Aotearoa - New Zealand.

How will the challenge help?

The good news is we can reduce contamination from our recycling bins, while also getting the milk tops recycled into new products if we collect them separately.

Schools are a good community collection point and adding a challenge adds to the fun for all. Your tamariki will be leaders for positive change, while helping their school's chance to win prizes.

What tops are we collecting?

We will accept all coloured tops from 1,2 or 3-litre dairy milk and cream bottles. Tops from alternative milk that comes in bottles are okay, but no boxed/Tetra Pak milk tops please.

What are the students asked to do?

For all of term 2 your tamariki will be asked to separate and collect milk bottle tops at home. The tops should be brought into their school for collection. They will be motivated to do something positive for their community and win prizes for their school!



How can you support this challenge?

Get the whole whanau involved in the habit of separating tops from bottles. Show your children how to give the tops a quick rinse, air dry and then collect in a dedicated reusable container. Your school will let you know when to bring them to school.

* Please stick to your usual buying habits. Don't be tempted to replace your 3-litre bottle with 3 x 1-litre bottles to collect more tops. We don't want to create more recycling!

Do we need to wash the milk tops?

Yes please! It's important to rinse and air dry your tops before sending them into school, otherwise they may get a bit stinky.

Where will the collected milk tops end up?

After the challenge, we will be sending the milk tops to Egmont Refuse & Recycling Ltd in Hawera. The tops will get shredded, and the chips get sold to local fabricators and made into new items.

What are the school prizes?

The winning school in the New Plymouth – Ngāmotu district (average of most tops collected per student) wins a \$1,000 voucher from Mitre 10, $2^{\rm nd}$ wins a \$500 voucher and $3^{\rm nd}$ wins a \$250 voucher. There will also be spot prizes for students! The winning school in Taranaki will win a trophy.

Why is this Challenge not available to all schools?

Your school is participating in a special trial to see if we make a difference in particular suburbs. If this trial is successful, it may be expanded to other areas of New Plymouth – Ngāmotu.
