Notifying Caregivers of Head Injuries



From next term, there will be a change to the way we notify caregivers about student head injuries. Currently, our practice is to contact caregivers by phone for all head injuries. Moving forward, minor head injuries will instead be communicated via a text message sent to the child's caregivers. This will help us streamline communication while continuing to keep you informed. We kindly ask that caregivers reply to the text message to acknowledge receipt. If you require

further information about the head knock, please contact the school office directly who will be happy to discuss with you. Any injuries requiring immediate medical attention will continue to be escalated via a phone call to caregivers.

High School Enrolments 2026

The process for enrolling Year 8 students for high school is soon to begin. Caregivers are responsible for organising the enrolment of their children at their preferred high school. We are happy to assist with co-ordinating promotional visits and enrolment interviews for New Plymouth Girls' High School and New Plymouth Boys' High School here at school, however open days and visits to the high schools are the responsibility of caregivers.
