2026 Class Placement

This is the time of year when we begin the placement of students for 2026. We will again have some classes with singular year groups and some composite classes as we align to the new curriculum expectations.

As the system we use for student placement will be changing, we invite parents to share information around their child's placement for next year. We make no promises but do take parent shared information into account when placing students. This is not an opportunity to directly request a teacher as staff placements for 2026 have not yet been confirmed, or a particular student for your child to be placed with, but rather an opportunity to share the things that will help your child make the most of their learning opportunities, for example – strengths in maths, P.E. or writing. In the past, parents have shared information about students they would like their child to be separated from e.g. cousins etc. As these requests can change over time and were stored on the previous system, please ensure you update us if you would like these to continue to apply.




Book Fair 2025
