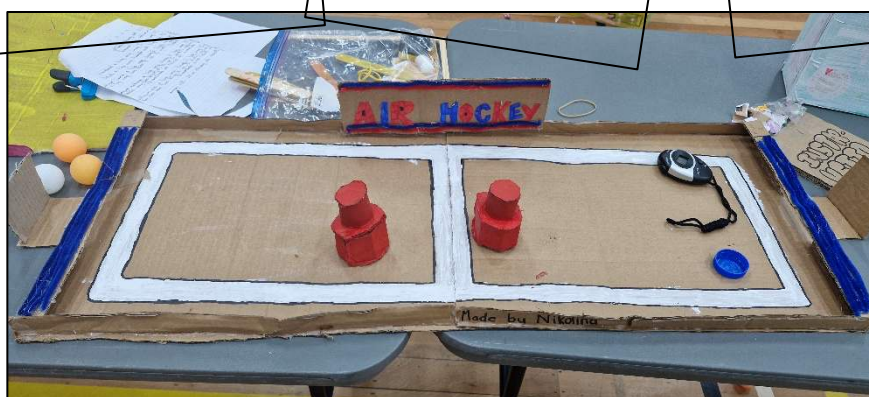

## From the Bell Block School Board

Our Board had its regular meeting last week and would like to share the following message with you:

As you may be aware, recent changes to the Education and Training Act have removed the legal requirements for school boards to give effect to Te Tiriti o Waitangi. However, our commitment to honouring and upholding Te Tiriti remains unwavering. At Bell Block School, we uphold Te Tiriti o Waitangi as a living partnership founded on equity, dignity, and respect for all peoples – not merely a symbolic or procedural commitment. As such, Te Tiriti will continue to be woven into the fabric of our kura as a regular part of what we do. While we are no longer required to report our tikanga mō te kura to the Ministry, our school values, direction, and community-developed events will remain unchanged.

Over many years we have worked closely with Te Atiawa iwi and Puketapu hapū to develop our tikanga, programmes and school to meet the needs of all learners, develop a strong connection to our place and for our students to have a sense of belonging that lasts well after they have left our school, moved on to high school and beyond.

At our school, the values of *Whakaute – Respect, Manaakitanga - Caring, Takohanga – Responsibility, and Tū Māia - Standing Brave*, again developed by our community, are deeply aligned with the principles of partnership, participation and protection that underpin Te Tiriti. The Board and school believe that upholding Te Tiriti within the educational context enables all ākonga and their whānau to be successful. Our policies, practices and everyday actions will continue to reflect Te Tiriti through our inclusion of te reo Māori, tikanga, mātauranga Māori and commitment to inclusive approaches that honour all whānau.

Our curriculum is already grounded in culturally responsive pedagogy, localised curriculum and ongoing professional development to build the cultural capacity of all kaiako. We are also committed to building strong relationships with Te Atiawa iwi and Puketapu hapū. Together, these commitments will continue to embed Te Tiriti throughout the daily life and direction of our kura.

## Vision and Hearing Screening

Vision and hearing screening is completed by Te Whatu Ora Health New Zealand Vision and Hearing Technicians at our school. **The technician will be visiting our school on Tuesday 9 December** to test eligible children for vision and/or hearing. Eligible children include:

- **New Entrants**

Routine screening is completed for children who are new to school, and/or have not completed their B4 School Check and/or require further testing post B4 School Check.

- **Year 7 Students**

Routine vision screening is completed for all Year 7 students and Year 8 students who have not completed the Year 7 screening and/or students that require further testing.

If you have any queries or concerns, or do not wish for your child to have this screening done, please contact the school office.

### Te Rā Whanaungatanga – Friday 30 January 2026

Early next year we will also hold our *Te Rā Whanaungatanga* day again. This was introduced at the beginning of this year and was well received by both our community and staff as a way of settling students into the new year and reducing the anxiety of the first few days of school.

Whanaungatanga is about creating family connection. It is built through shared experiences, getting to know each other and working together throughout the year.



Our Te Rā Whanaungatanga will provide families with the opportunity to come to school with their child and meet the teacher in a less formal setting, share information about the child and begin to develop a strong relationship between school and home. It will also provide students with an opportunity to see their new spaces, bring in stationery to ease the load on the first day of school and get their desks set up. We hope this will assist students to feel more settled at a time that some students find uncomfortable.

Classrooms will be open on **Friday 30 January between 9:30am – 10:30am** and again between **11:00am – 12:30pm**. Whānau may come in at a time that suits you and go to the classrooms where staff will be waiting to welcome you. Please note that students must be accompanied by an adult.
